1. **Job description:** CTL 1011H – Anti-Oppression Education in School Settings
2. **Course description:** In this course we will identify ways that systems of oppression and oppressive educational practices manifest themselves in school settings - for example, within interactions between teachers and students; administrators and students; students and students; students and the curriculum; teachers and the curriculum; administrators and teachers; teachers and parents; parents and administrators - and we will discuss how we can use these spaces or locate new ones to do anti-oppressive educational work in school settings. Emphasis in the course will be placed on integrating anti-oppressive educational theory with anti-oppressive educational practice. We will attempt to link our discussions of practice to theory and our discussions of theory to practice.
3. **Estimated course enrolment:** 20-25

5. **Class schedule:** Thursday 17:00 – 20:00
6. **Sessional dates of appointment:** September 1 to December 31, 2008
7. **Salary:** Base rate for half course of \$ 6,500.00 (inclusive of vacation pay)
8. **Qualifications:** Candidates must have a doctorate in relevant discipline and some evidence of published scholarship demonstrating expertise in the area of anti-oppression education and critical pedagogy. Preference will be given to individuals with prior graduate teaching experience in this area.
9. **Duties:** Prepare, organize, and teach this half-course graduate seminar; be available to students seeking assistance between classes; evaluate and provide students with feedback on their work.
10. **Applications:** All applications must be received by June 4, 2008. Please indicate in a letter of application why you believe your experience qualifies you to teach this particular course.
