1. **Job description:** CTL 7001H: Educational Professionalism, Ethics and the Law

2. **Course description:** This course will enable students to analyze the interrelated legal and ethical conditions that shape the classroom context specifically and educational change generally. The impact of community and collaboration upon the curriculum and the role of the teacher are studied in detail. Topics include leadership theories, the legal context of education, parental participation, and the influence of collegial relationships with students, parents, community, government and social business agencies upon the classroom and the school. This course is normally open only to students in the M.T. in Elementary and Intermediate Education program.

3. **Estimated course enrolment:** 20-25

6. **Sessional dates of appointment:** September 1, 2008 to April 30, 2009

7. **Salary:** Base rate for half course of \$ 6,500.00 (inclusive of vacation pay)

8. **Qualifications:** Candidates must have a master or doctorate degree in relevant discipline and some evidence of published scholarship demonstrating expertise in the area of professionalism, ethics and the law. Preference will be given to individuals with prior graduate teaching experience in this area.

9. **Duties:** Prepare, organize, and teach this half-course graduate seminar; be available to students seeking assistance between classes; evaluate and provide students with feedback on their work. Teacher candidate supervision during Practica will be required and paid as an additional prorated amount based on the number of students supervised. Where applicable, program co-ordination may be required of an MT instructor and paid as an additional amount.
