1. **Job description:** CTL 7004Y: Practicum in Schools
2. **Course description:** This course provides supervised experience in an area of fieldwork, under the direction of faculty and field personnel. Students are placed in partnership schools in public and separate school systems and in other settings. Students are under the joint supervision of a field teacher on site and an academic staff member at OISE, University of Toronto. The practicum provides a minimum of 40 days of field experience. This course is normally open only to students in the M.T. in Elementary and Intermediate Education program.
3. **Estimated course enrolment:** 20-25
4. **TA support:** none
5. **Class schedule:** Section: 0131 – Tuesday 13:00-16:00

6. **Sessional dates of appointment:** September 1, 2008 to April 30, 2009
7. **Salary:** Base rate for full course of \$13,000.00 (inclusive of vacation pay)
8. **Qualifications:** Candidates must have a master or doctorate degree in relevant discipline and some evidence of published scholarship demonstrating expertise in the area of practice teaching. Preference will be given to individuals with prior graduate teaching experience in this area.
9. **Duties:** Prepare, organize, and teach this full-course graduate seminar; be available to students seeking assistance between classes; evaluate and provide students with feedback on their work. Teacher candidate supervision during Practica will be required and paid as an additional prorated amount based on the number of students supervised. Where applicable, program co-ordination may be required of an MT instructor and paid as an additional amount.
