ECO325H1F,S Advanced Economic Theory – Macro (Section L5101 in Fall, Section L0101 in Spring)

This course develops the microeconomic foundations of macroeconomic theory and expands students' analytic skills by constructing and solving macroeconomic models. Topics may include: dynamic choice, neoclassical growth theory, uncertainty and rational expectations, business cycles, as well as fiscal and monetary policy.
