MLS 1100 – Museology and Theory

The objective of this seminar is to introduce a range of issues occupying contemporary museology: typology of museums; object, authenticity; and experience; the relationship of museums to their communities; ethics and public service; the museum as educator; and aesthetics and the museum. This course is not intended to be comprehensive but will provide a philosophical and theoretical framework for future museum professionals.

Teaching Assistance will be provided if enrolment is sufficient.

Salary: \$6,275 (Sessional Lecturer I) - \$6,775 (Sessional Lecturer II) per term

Qualifications:

Preferably candidates will have a completed, or nearly completed, PhD degree in an area related to the course or a Master's degree plus extensive professional experience in an area related to the course. Teaching experience preferred.

Note: Graduate Students who are currently registered in a PhD Program at the University of Toronto are members of CUPE 3902 Unit 1 and are not eligible to apply for this position.

Description of Duties:

- Obtaining placements and matching students with placements
- Preparing course materials
- Delivering course content (e.g., seminars, lectures, and labs)
- Developing and administering course assignments
- Grading
- Supervising and collaborating with the work supervisors
- Holding regular office hours
